RE-OPENING SMALL GROUPS: FROM ZOOM TO "HYBRID" ZOOM GROUPS

Many of our churches have been streaming their worship services for years. It safe to say that the great majority of our churches have been streaming (or learning how to stream) their services since March, 2020. COVID-19 has ushered in a new normal for pastors and churches as we all try to figure out ho to progress through the pandemic, which is now in its fifth month.

As we have walked through this together, the TBBA has given special attention to how our churches have overseen their re-opening strategies. Most now have resumed some form of public worship gatherings. Early on, we encouraged many churches to transition their entire small group schedules to online groups in Zoom. Few churches have chosen to return to on-site or off-site Sunday School and small group gatherings and most churches have not resumed any type of Sunday School fellowship at all.

In every case, I fear the prolonged loss of in-person fellowship in small groups will cause some to permanently step away from Christ and the church. While continuing to offer Zoon groups, I believe that it is critical that we are able to gather some church members together in face to face small groups.

Until that kind of fellowship can be fully and safely restored (whether in home-based group: or back on our campuses, or both), I believe that it is best to think "outside the box" and ge some of the people safely gathering together in small groups.

One way to do this is for smaller churches to lead their adult Sunday School classes to me in the fellowship hall, sanctuary, and a large Sunday School assembly room (with their children, if applicable). One or two classes most likely could safely distance and meet in each environment. Because many churches only have a few Sunday School classes, this could make a significant impact on the entire church family.

Another great idea is for Sunday School classes in larger rooms or in off-campus groups to rotate their members to meet every other week or every third week. This would of course have to be done while maintaining distancing.

One church in particular has moved their Sunday School and small groups into what they are calling Zoom "hybrid" groups. This a classroom (or living room) setting, where people who want to gather together in person can spread out enough in a larger room to meet distancing guidelines. At the same time, in that same room, they start a Zoom meeting on a

computer that is connected to a TV or monitor - complete with a Web cam, a 360-degree microphone, and some speakers. And voila, it's a hybrid group: folks meeting in person while meeting with folks who are joining the group remotely.

None of this is ideal, but in a season where the word "unprecedented" can actually be used correctly, it's something. And I hope you will be encouraged by these ideas. I also hope you will share with me and our Associational churches how you have used your own creative ways to make the best of the situation.


