THE CROSS AND THE RESURRECTION



Bible commentators have stated that Isaiah 53 is the most quoted and alluded to Old Testament chapter in the New Testament. Sometimes this chapter is referred to as the "Suffering Servant" and we understand that it was clearly pointing ahead to the sufferings and crucifixion of Jesus Christ. This Easter season is a great time for God's people to be

reminded from this chapter of the depths of suffering that our Savior went through to provide salvation for us.

Isaiah 53

3 He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.

4 Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.

5 But he was pierced for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his wounds we are healed.

6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

8 By oppression and judgment he was taken away; and as for his generation, who considered that he was cut off out of the land of the living, stricken for the transgression of my people?

10 Yet it was the will of the Lord to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for guilt, he shall see his offspring; he shall prolong his days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.

In verse 3 it is stated twice that the Servant was despised, He was rejected by men,

and acquainted with grief. Verse 5 states that He was pierced for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. Verse 10 again mentions that the Lord crushed Him. According to Thomas Constable, "the words "pierced" and "crushed" describe extreme distress resulting in death. The Hebrew words behind these terms are the strongest ones in that language that describe violent and excruciating death." Verse 8 states that He was cut off from the land of the living which indicates that this future Servant would in fact die. However, the same verse indicates, what we celebrate this Easter Sunday, that the Lord shall prolong His days. This clearly pointed to the resurrection of our Lord.

All of the suffering and pain described in this chapter was for those of us who He has redeemed. The word "our" occurs four times (our griefs, our sorrows, our transgressions, our iniquities). The word "us" occurs two times (brought us peace, laid on Him the iniquity of us all). The word "we" occurs five times (we esteemed Him not, we esteemed Him stricken, with His wounds we are healed, all we ... have gone astray, we have turned ... to his own way).

The most remarkable truth from this chapter is that this was the Lord's doing. It is stated, "the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all"; "it was the will of the Lord to crush Him"; "He has put Him to grief".

Our God and Savior suffered and died in our place on the cross so that all of our transgressions and iniquites could be forgiven. Then He rose again on the third day. Hallelujah what a Savior!

The last several years have revealed that the church is not immune from the problem of abuse, and that many ministries are not equipped to resist abuse or appropriately respond to allegations of abuse. ECAP was formed to equip ministry leaders to develop and implement sensible policies and procedures that protect kids and deter predators.

ECAP has developed a set of Child Safety Standards, covering the topics of Governance, Child Safety Operations, Screening, Training and Response. These Standards are the basis of an accreditation program, which independently verifies that an organization complies to defined standards. Christian ministries that serve children are invited to apply to become Accreditation Candidate Members in order to begin the process of becoming compliant to our Child Safety Standards. By becoming an ECAP member, you gain access to a number of products and resources which will help you align with their Standards.




