TOO BIG FOR OUR BRITCHES



One of my favorite times of the year is the college football season and I am looking forward to the 2025 season starting in the next few weeks. I remember back in 2012 when Texas A&M redshirt freshman, Johnny Manziel won the Heisman Trophy as the best college football player. He was electrifying and was destined for long-term greatness. But somewhere along the line Johnny quit doing what he had been doing to

become so great. He fell into a lot of off-field controversy and even began doing drugs. His professional career ended before it ever got started and I believe that one of the reasons for this was that "he became too big for his britches". This metaphoric idiom alludes to becoming so "swollen" with conceit that one's pants no longer fit.

Like Johnny Manziel did with his football career, we can humbly start out in Christian ministry in awe of the fact that the Lord of everything would choose to use us. But somewhere along the way we can stop doing what we were doing to become useable by God and start to minister in our own strength. We can get too big for our britches.

In Deuteronomy 17, Moses gave a warning to future kings to help them continue to depend on the Lord throughout their reigns and avoid the temptation to fall into the lie that they could lead Israel or Judah in their own strength and wisdom. The future kings were to be exemplary leaders who did not cut corners. In chapter 17, Moses prohibited the kings from building up a large military organization by multiplying horses (v. 16). This could lead to a false sense of security, and departure from dependence on God. The kings were not to multiply wives (v. 17), since these women would inevitably turn the king's heart away from his devotion and obedience to the LORD. The final warning was that they were not to obtain a large personal fortune (v. 17) because this too would lead to

a false sense of security and a divided allegiance. Unfortunately most of the kings of Israel and Judah did not obey these three warnings.

And finally, every king was commanded to personally write down a copy of God's law. (v. 18). Some commentators believe that this is a reference to the book of Deuteronomy. The king was to read this law throughout his lifetime: "all the days of his life". This discipline would enable a king to walk humbly and wisely with the LORD so that he could lead the people to obey His will.

We have never been a king, we probably weren't great athletes, but most of us are leaders in gospel ministry. Let's be careful to live in humble dependence on our Lord, to obey His warnings, and to personally focus our attention on God's word by reading it and obeying it everyday.
